BARRIERS TO INCLUSION

Management accountants who do not report ES information give the following reasons:

60% say no demand from decision-makers

34% believe it's not part of their role

38% say systems and processes don't support the inclusion of ES data

33% say data are unavailable/ unreliable

31% lack knowledge or training

75% issues can impact cost, risk, and value
